

January Club Meeting Gabe has arranged for us to go to Larry Fiske's place. The date is Saturday January 11, 10 AM. Gabe says this: Larry is the publisher of the newsletter of the Vermont Auto Enthusiasts. He is a restorer who has two early 1900's Dodges in the process of being restored. He has 3 more cars finished, 1960's I think, in the rest of the barn. He has a large shop in a heated barn. There are milling machines, drill presses, etc. The address is 2503 Duffy Hill Road Enosburg. It is probably 4-5 miles outside of Enosburg Falls proper. You go across the bridge and turn right onto a dirt road that takes you to his place. We should proceed along Duffy Hill Road going south

for about five miles from Enosburg Falls and look for Mountain View Auto Body. Larry's place will be on the opposite side of the road and a little bit farther up the hill.

On a map that I have, and looking on Mapquest...from Main Street in Enosburg Falls proceed south on Route 108, cross the bridge over the Mississquoi River. Very soon take a (dirt) road called either Carpenter Road or Duffy Hill Road off to the right. Proceed the 4-5 miles mentioned by Gabe. Here is a map:
